### WHAT ELSE CAN YOU DO WITH YOUR STUFF?

There is a thrift store in Coupeville, **New Beginnings**, at 402 N. Main Street. They accept clothing and small household goods. Proceeds benefit Harbor Haven. They are open Tues.-Sat., 11-4. Phone 678-0537

**Island Thrift** in Oak Harbor, 600 SE Barrington, also accepts gently used clothing, household goods, books, small appliances. Profits go back to the community, Island wide. They are open for donations Mon.-Sat. 9-4, and store hours are 9-5:30, Mon.-Sat. Phone 675-1133

**Coupeville Lions Club** accepts donations for their annual garage sale (June 27-28). They accept almost everything, in good condition, except clothing... including vehicles, boats and trailers! All proceeds go back to the community. Call 678-4105 for pickup.
